 - Critical water supply/ quality needs of DACs




- Critical water supply/ quality needs of DACs
 - County DEH small water systems
 - Groundwater contamination in San Dieguito and San Diego basins
 - Water conservation education to DACs in urbanized areas (Pueblo/Otay)
 - Chollas Creek TMDL (metals, bacteria)
 - Flooding at creek constrictions
 - Support for LID techniques
 - Leaking septic systems


