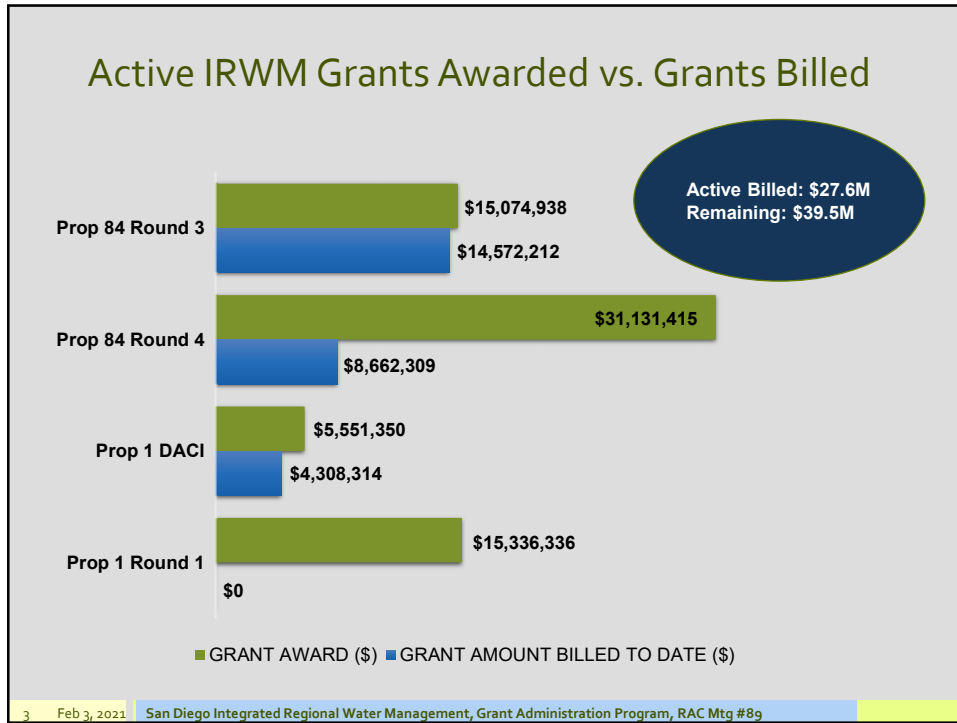

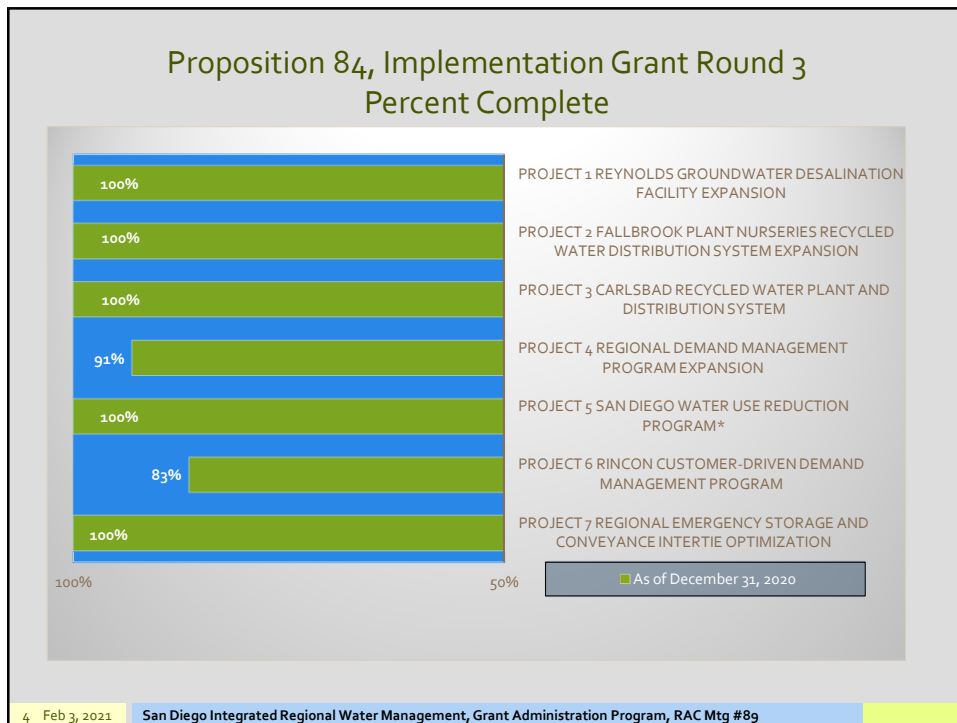

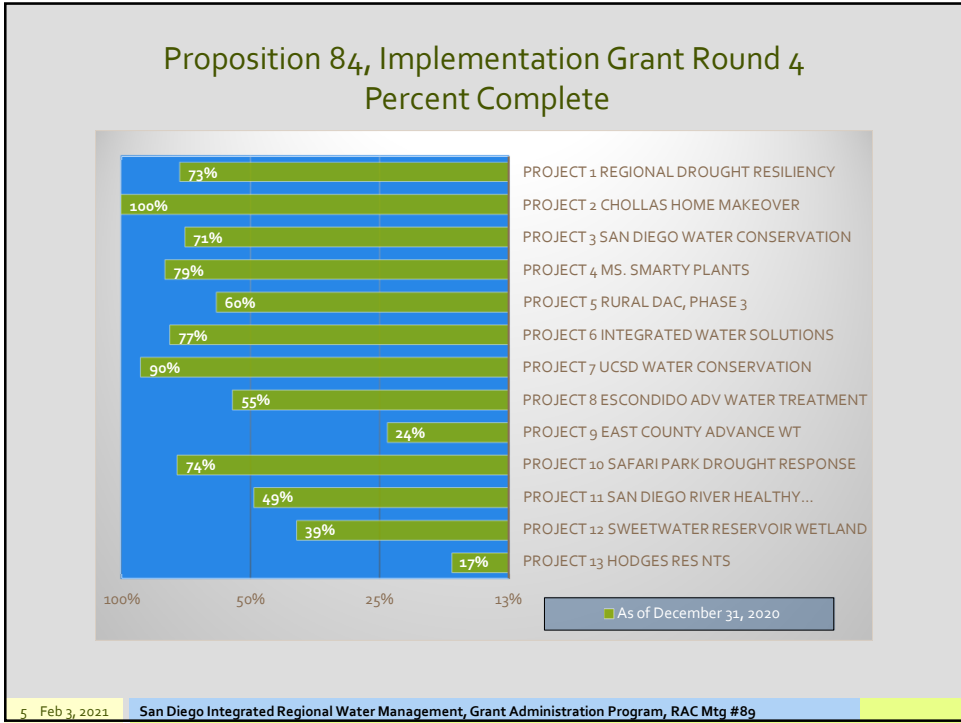

The Eight Principles of Water Harvesting

1. Begin with long and thoughtful observation.
2. Start at the top (highpoint) of your watershed and work your way down.
3. Start small and simple.
4. Slow, spread, and infiltrate the flow of water.
5. Maximize living and organic groundcover.
6. Always plan an overflow route, and manage that overflow as a resource.
7. Maximize beneficial relationships and efficiency by "stacking functions."
8. Continually reassess your systems: the "feedback loop."

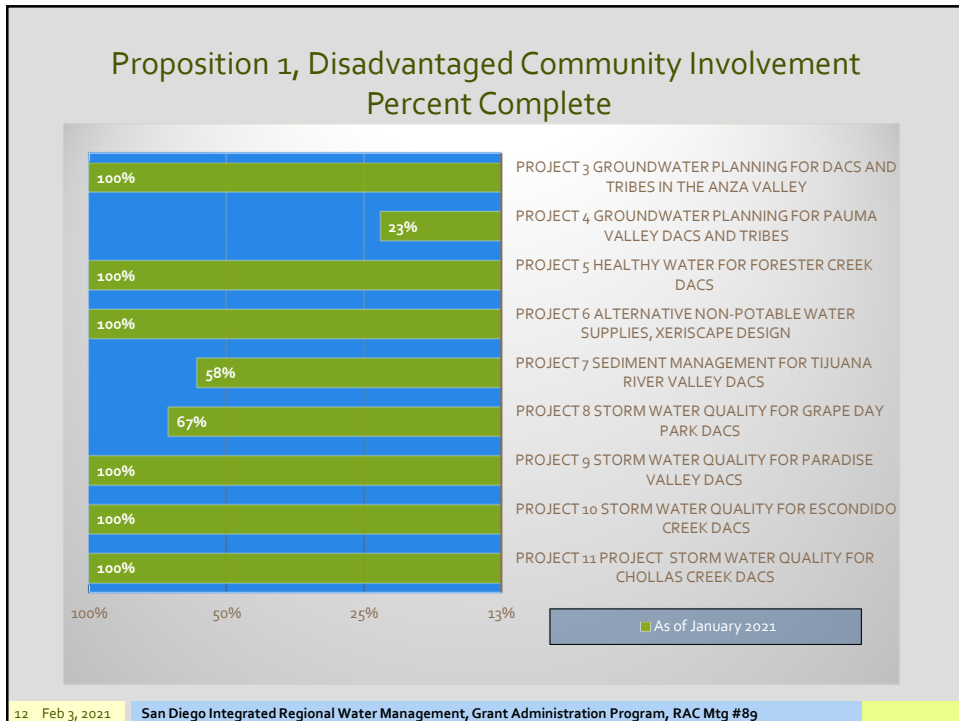

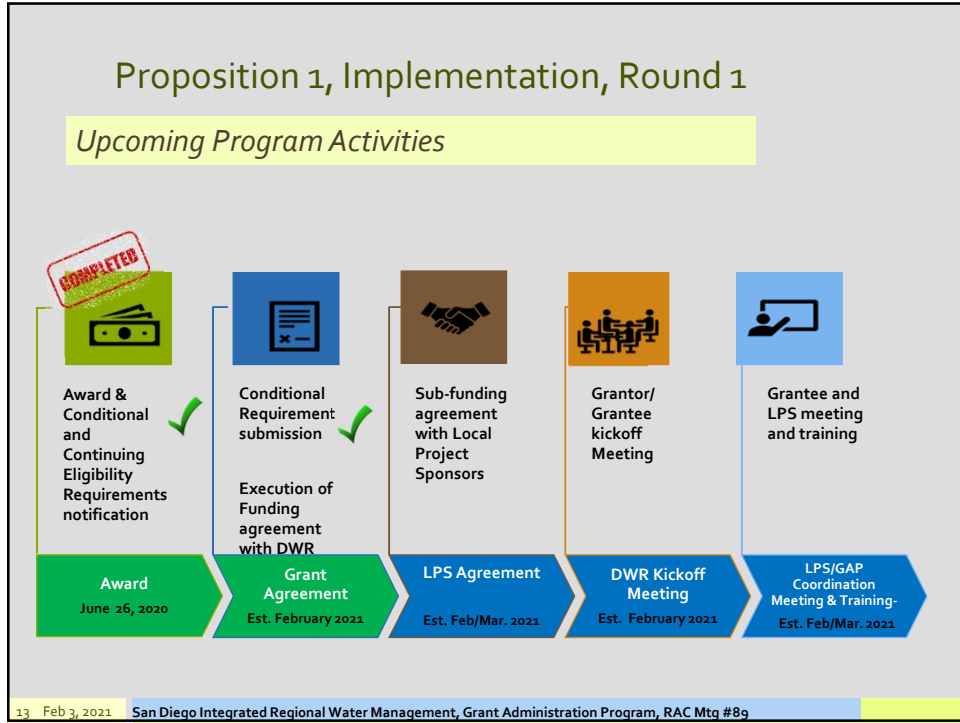
