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
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
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Water Use Efficiency Incentive Project

- Incentives reduce financial barriers for URCs.
- Target residential and multifamily customers
- Includes indoor and outdoor incentives program and a community development program.
- A resource database was included as an optional task depending on the project sponsor's ability to implement





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Public Review Period

Comment	Response
Would CII projects qualify for funding to replace non-functional turf? They would score low based on the final prioritization criteria.	Final prioritization criteria was developed as SDIRWM's internal criteria. CII turf replacement projects could qualify for funding depending on the grant program's eligibility.
Would a local groundwater project to inject recycled water into the ground to create a seawater barrier to protect existing brackish wells used for desalination/RO potable water projects get support for a study? If so, would there be a way to add this as a Priority Project Concept?	Not considered for this effort but will consider this project concept for future efforts. Add to the project concept table in Appendix A.
Suggestion to add the use of irrigation with seawater for salt-tolerant turf locations that have ocean water available such as Mission Bay and San Diego Bay.	Add to the project concept table in Appendix A, but not incorporated into project as described in TM.

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- Drought Resiliency Projects
 - Purpose: Funding for on the ground projects and modeling tools that will increase water reliability and improve water management
 - Note: If recycled water project is eligible for Title XVI/WIIN, it is not eligible for Drought Resiliency Funding
 - Funding:
 - Up to \$500,000 for projects to be completed within 2 years
 - Up to \$5 million large projects to be completed within 3 years
 - Cost share: 50% or greater
 - Status: Application due October 31, 2023

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- WaterSMART Cooperative Watershed Management Program Phase 1
 - Purpose: Watershed group development, watershed restoration planning, and watershed management project design.
 - Funding:
 - Up to \$300,000 per applicant
 - Cost share: 25-30% per application submittal period contingent on appropriations
 - Status: First round due December 5, 2023; Second round due September 3, 2024

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- WaterSMART Planning and Project Design Grants
 - Purpose: Projects to conduct planning to support water supply and management solutions (e.g. domestic water supply projects for DACs, water marketing, water conservation, drought resiliency, and ecological resilience).
 - Funding:
 - Up to \$400,000 per application for projects that can be completed within 3 years
 - Cost share: 0%, 25%, or 50% depending on project type
 - Status: First round due October 17, 2023; Second round due April 2, 2024

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- Small Surface Water and Groundwater Storage Projects
 - Purpose: Funding for planning, design, and construction of small surface water and groundwater storage facilities.
 - Must have a completed feasibility study that meets the requirements of USBR's Directives and Standards by September 18, 2023
 - Funding:
 - * \$25,000,000 available
 - Cost share: 75%
 - Status: Application due November 30, 2023

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- WaterSMART Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration Projects
 - Purpose: Funding for design and construction of aquatic ecosystem restoration projects that are collaboratively developed, have widespread regional benefits, and are for the purpose of improving of the health of fisheries, wildlife, and aquatic habitat through restoration and improve fish passage.
 - Funding:
 - Up to \$500,000 \$2 million per project for Study and Design
 - Up to \$3 million \$20 million per project for construction
 - Cost share: 35% or greater
 - Status: Second round due January 24, 2024
