

Water Bonds Update

AB 1567
Safe Drinking Water, Wildfire Prevention, Drought Preparation, Flood Protection, Extreme Heat Mitigation, Clean Energy, and Workforce Development Bond Act of 2024

(\$15,995,000,000)

Priority is to finance projects for safe drinking water, wildfire prevention, drought preparation, flood protection, extreme heat mitigation, clean energy, and workforce development programs.

IRWM is allotted \$350 million under the Ensuring Safe Drinking Water, Drought Preparation, Enhancing the State's Flood Protection category.

To be heard by the Senate Natural Resources & Water and Governance & Finance Committees

As amended March 26, 2023. Proposed ballot on March 5, 2024, Statewide Primary Election

Water Bonds Update

SB 867

Drought, Flood, and Water Resilience, Wildfire and Forest Resilience, Coastal Resilience, Extreme Heat Mitigation, Biodiversity and Nature-Based Climate Solutions, Climate Smart Agriculture, and Park Creation and Outdoor Access, and Clean Energy Bond of 2024

(\$15,500,000,000)

Priority is to finance projects for drought, flood, and water resilience, wildfire and forest resilience, coastal resilience, extreme heat mitigation, biodiversity and nature-based climate solutions, climate smart agriculture, park creation and outdoor access, and clean energy programs.

IRWM is allotted **\$300 million** under the Drought, Flood, and Water Resilience category.





U.S. Bureau of Reclamation



- Water Energy Efficiency Grants
 - Purpose: Provide funding for projects that result in quantifiable water savings, implement renewable energy components, and support broader sustainability benefits
 - Funding: \$50 million in FY 2024 and FY 2025
 - \$500,000 for smaller projects to be completed in 2 years
 - \$2 million for projects to be completed in 3 years
 - \$5 million for larger projects to be completed in 3 years
 - Cost share: 50% or greater
 - Status: Application due February 22, 2024 or October 30, 2024

- WaterSMART Cooperative Watershed Management Program Phase 1
 - Purpose: Watershed group development, watershed restoration planning, and watershed management project design.
 - Funding:
 - Up to \$300,000 per applicant
 - Cost share: 25-30% per application submittal period contingent on appropriations
 - Status: Second round due September 3, 2024

- WaterSMART Planning and Project Design Grants
 - Purpose: Projects to conduct planning to support water supply and management solutions (e.g. domestic water supply projects for DACs, water marketing, water conservation, drought resiliency, and ecological resilience).
 - Funding:
 - Up to \$400,000 per application for projects that can be completed within 3 years
 - Cost share: 0%, 25%, or 50% depending on project type
 - Status: Second round due April 2, 2024

U.S. Bureau of Reclamation



- Native American Affairs: Emergency Drought Relief for Tribes
 - Purpose: Provide near-term drought relief actions to mitigate drought impacts for Indian Tribes that are impacted by the operation of a Reclamation water project.
 - Funding: \$12.5 million
 - ❖ \$500,000 per proposal
 - Cost share: Reclamation will evaluate the applicant's ability to meet cost share
 - Status: Application due April 11, 2024

U.S. Bureau of Reclamation



- WaterSMART: Title XVI WIIN Act Water Reclamation and Reuse Projects for Fiscal Years 2023 and 2024
 - Purpose: Provides financial and technical assistance to local water agencies for the planning, design, and construction of water reclamation and reuse projects.
 - The project must have a completed Title XVI feasibility study submitted to Reclamation for review by August 30, 2024.
 - Funding: \$179 million
 - Up to \$30 million per project
 - Cost share: 75% or more
 - · Status: Second round due September 30, 2024
