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



~\$16M available to the San Diego IRWM Region for implementation projects




Proposal Solicitation Package (PSP) expected by end of 2021 from Department of Water Resources

Prepare for Upcoming Opportunities

- Materials to prepare in advance:
 - Feasibility study or preliminary design
 - Updated itemized project budget
 - Schedule (planning and construction)
 - · Insurance documents
 - Strategy for CEQA and permits
- Ensure project is listed in an existing plan, if required

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Recommendations for Success, cont.

- Be sure your project addresses the priorities of the funding program
- Use available resources
- Write a focused application
 - Clearly answer each question
 - Tailor approach to scoring criteria
 - Scoring Criteria found in the IRWM Plan is adapted to each round of funding: https://sdirwmp.org/pdf/SDIRWM_09_Projects_FINAL_2019.pdf.
- Don't be afraid to ask questions


The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has released notice for the new Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities 2020 and Flood Mitigation Assistance 2020 funding programs. Applicants are reguired to submit a Notice of Interest fire in 1971. The Notice of Interest period for both programs will open on September 1, 2020 and <u>close on</u> <u>September 18, 2020.</u> The application period opens at the end of September.
