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
How Recommendations will be Used

Not all attendees had opportunity to provide feedback on these




- IRWM Support for Stakeholders:
 - · Cash flow is a challenge*
 - Create group to work with URCs before grant cycles to develop projects
 - 100% advanced funding for DACs in all future water bonds
 - O&M Funding, including better coordination with public lands agency



- Future of SDIRWM:
 - Climate change resiliency planning
 - On-going capacity building project development (project management)



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Underrepresented Community Project Support

- Underrepresented community (URC) projects often face additional hurdles to planning, securing funding, implementation, and on-going maintenance
- Project Selection Workgroup (PSW) had in-depth discussion on how to best set URC projects up for success
- RAC had discussion in October 2019 on strategies to support URC projects
- SDIRWM Summit discussion topic



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Existing Support for URC Projects

- Technical workshop on submitting to project database (OPTI)
- IRWM Program and grant writing staff available for questions before and during Call for Projects
- GAP provides grant process guidance, administrative assistance, training and coordination
- Sponsored advanced funding legislation

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Existing Support for URC Projects

- Encourage partnerships to support URC projects
- NGO may assist URCs with implementation and to overcome lack of technical capacity
- Advocate to DWR for process improvements that benefit URCs



The RWMG will continue to provide support for Project Sponsors, including URCs, and share resources/information with stakeholders.

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October 2019 RAC Discussion on URC Assistance

- How can we improve our existing support structure?
- What are some mechanisms to address these challenges? What can SDIRWM do?
 - · With what resources?
- Are there additional NGO partnerships that would be beneficial to DACs in addressing some of these challenges?

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Outcomes from RAC Discussion

- Additional challenges:
 - Contracting delays and cash flow results in compressed timelines
 - · Compliance with DWR processes
 - Urgent water quality/supply needs not appropriate for IRWM, due to length of process









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Outcomes from RAC Discussion

- Suggestions:
 - Flexibility for URCs to use a programmatic scope in grant applications
 - Provide joint feedback with other IRWM regions to advocate for changes at State
 - Partnerships, such as fiscal partnership with larger NGOs
 - Add an intermediary step in application process for URC projects to provide feedback prior to evaluation against other projects
 - Involve regulators in pre-application discussions, or people knowledgeable about permitting to provide feedback/advice

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New RWMG Actions



- 7 virtual one-on-one URC working sessions targeting URCs with projects under development, who have yet to receive IRWM funding
 - Common funding opportunities and typical timelines
 - How to prepare for grants
 - Common grant requirements, if awarded
 - Common challenges to success
- "Grants 101" presentation for future RAC meeting

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
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Water Resilience Portfolio

- Executive Order N-10-19 called for a "portfolio of actions to ensure the state's long-term water resilience and ecosystem health"
 - Portfolio initiative presented at August 2019 RAC Meeting
 - RWMG submitted a comment letter on the Draft Portfolio in February 2020
- Final Water Resilience Portfolio released July 28
- RWMG is currently reviewing the Portfolio's 140+ actions
- We anticipate holding a future discussion on the final Portfolio's actions

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Prop 1 Implementation Grant

- Final award June 26, 2020
- Fully funded! \$15.3M
- Up to 12 months to complete CEQA and permitting needed to begin construction
